As part of the Biodiversity Beat series, which highlights efforts supporting the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, CO-OP4CBD partner Robin Goffaux from the Foundation for Research and Biodiversity (FRB) was interviewed by David Ainsworth during SBSTTA-26 in Nairobi, Kenya.



We published <u>a call for experts</u> which was used to identify **thematic experts** to actively participate in shaping **sciencepolicy processes** for the Convention on Biological Diversity in the European Union and Associated Countries. 2024 has been a big year for biodiversity policy. As the world's eyes turns to COP16 in Colombia, check out some of the important recent developments in the field:



The 26th meeting of the **Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA)** took place in Nairobi, Kenya in May 2024. The conference concluded with nine recommendations on the implementation of the KM-GFB. You can find the full report <u>here</u>.



Also in Nairobi in May, the Subsidiary Body on Implementation (SBI) came together for its fourth meeting. 14 recommendations were produced during its proceedings. You can find the full report <u>here</u>.
